Big Idea: The Holy Spirit Empowers us to be the Men God Designed us to Be.

A. A New *Master* (v.12–13)

"Obligated" is language of <u>ownership</u> and slavery.

For you know that you were *redeemed* from your empty way of life inherited from your ancestors, not with perishable things like silver or gold, but *with the precious blood of Christ.* — 1 Peter 1:18–19a (cf. Acts 20:28; Galatians 3:13; Ephesians 1:7)

Therefore, dear brothers and sisters, you have no obligation to do what your sinful nature urges you to do. — Romans 8:12 NLT

- We wrestle with the flesh, but we are not mastered by the flesh.
- It doesn't always <u>feel</u> this way, but it <u>is</u> this way.
- How do we "put to death the deeds of the body?" (cf. refer to last week) (Weed Killing)
 - 1. Pluck the <u>Root</u> address the *source*, not just the *symptoms*.
 - Consider: Am I looking for comfort in this?
 - Consider: Am I trying to be in *control* of this?
 - Consider: Am I looking for significance from this?
 - 2. Make *War*, not *Peace* with your sin.
 - Don't make <u>excuses</u> for your sin (i.e. "Everyone else does it" / "But they're a Democrat / Republican!")
 - Sin will <u>eclipse</u> SOLAR Eclipse) the presence and power of God in your life (Keller story)
 - "Be killing sin or sin will be killing you." John Owen
 - 3. Stick With It (Black Belt=White Belt who didn't give up)
 - 4. Get Some <u>Help</u> (v.12—"brothers and sisters" / "Never fight Alone!")

B. A New **Status** (v.14-16)

"Led by the Spirit" = not about guidance, but about <u>power</u>

Therefore, my dear friends...work out your own salvation with fear and trembling. **13** For it is *God who is working in you* both to *will* and to *work* according to his good purpose. — Philippians 2:12–13

Don't be drunk with wine, because that will ruin your life. Instead, *be filled with the Holy Spirit.* — Ephesians 5:15 NLT

"Abba, Father!" (cf. Galatians 4:6)

He said to them, "I am deeply grieved to the point of death. Remain here and stay awake." **35** He went a little farther, fell to the ground, and prayed that if it were possible, the hour might pass from him. **36** And he said, "*Abba*, Father! All things are possible for you. Take this cup away from me. Nevertheless, not what I will, but what you will." — Mark 14:34–36

- Application Question: How's your Prayer Life? ("Don't Talk to Strangers")
 - Do you talk to God like a <u>stranger</u>, or like a Father?
 - Do you realize how much the Father loves you? (Ephesians 3:14-21)
- Live like a <u>son</u> of God, not like a <u>slave</u> to sin

In the first century A.D. an adopted son was a son deliberately chosen by his adoptive father to perpetuate his name and inherit his estate; he was no whit inferior in status to a son born in the ordinary course of nature and might well enjoy the father's affection more fully and reproduce the father's character more worthily. — F.F. Bruce (*Romans*, 166)

- Stop questioning your <u>identity</u> and start living in it.
- Stop pursuing an identity and starting embracing the one you already have.
- C. A New *Inheritance* (v.17 cf. John 17:24–27; Ephesians 1:13–21; 1 John 3:2)
 - Best Life Now vs. Best Life <u>Later</u>
 - A <u>Hope</u> that Invades the Darkness (Prison Analogy)

A. The Sovereignty of God in Appointing Leaders

May the name of God be praised forever and ever, for wisdom and power belong to him. He changes the times and seasons; *he removes kings and establishes kings.* He gives wisdom to the wise and knowledge to those who have understanding.

— Daniel 2:21

This word is by decree of the watchers, and the decision is by command from the holy ones. This is so that the living will know that *the Most High is ruler over human kingdoms*. *He gives them to anyone he wants* and sets the lowliest of people over them. — Daniel 4:17

The Lord frustrates the counsel of the nations; he thwarts the plans of the peoples. The counsel of *the Lord* stands forever, the plans of *his* heart from generation to generation. — Psalm 33:10–11

The king's heart is a stream of water in the hand of the Lord; *he turns it wherever he will* — Proverbs. 21:1

Let everyone submit to the governing authorities, since *there is no authority except from God, and the authorities that exist are instituted by God.* — Romans 13:1ff

B. Honoring our Leaders

Submit to every human authority because of the Lord, whether to *the emperor* as the supreme authority 14 or to governors as those sent out by him to punish those who do what is evil and to praise those who do what is good. 15 For *it is God's will that you silence the ignorance of foolish people by doing good*. 16 Submit as free people, not using your freedom as a cover-up for evil, but as God's slaves. 17 *Honor everyone*. Love the brothers and sisters. Fear God. *Honor the emperor*. — 1 Peter 2:13–17

C. Praying for Our Leaders

First of all, then, I urge that petitions, prayers, intercessions, and thanksgivings be made for *everyone*, 2 for *kings and all those who are in authority,* so that we may lead a tranquil and quiet life in all godliness and dignity. 3 This is good, and it pleases God our Savior, 4 who wants *everyone* to be saved and to come to the knowledge of the truth.

— 1 Timothy 2:1–4
