Day 36: Reflection on Growth

Danish philosopher and theologian Søren Kierkegaard once said, "Life is lived forward but understood backward." As we enter the final five days of this 40-day journey, let's take some time to consider where we have been. As a church, we are in an important season of dependence and discernment - we have critical decisions to make that will shape the future of our fellowship. We don't want to operate in our own wisdom, understanding, or power. So we have spent 35 days seeking the Lord, asking for His wisdom, wanting to heed His invitation, laying our collective "yes" down, and following Him in wholehearted devotion.

What have been the most powerful moments for you over these last 35 days? And why?

Our focus scriptures for today are Psalm 66:5 & Philippians 1:6

⁵ "Come and see the wonders of God; His acts for humanity are awe-inspiring."

⁶ "I am sure of this, that He who started a good work in you will carry it on to completion until the day of Christ Jesus."

As an invitation to a spiritual practice—a way to say "yes, Lord," reflect on the last 35 days of devotions. Write down all that you have been thankful for during this season. Then, use the list as a framework and guide for connecting with God in prayer.

Prepare to walk with God into the day before us, let this old priestly blessing found in Numbers 6 be prayed over you:
